New to the CCRR Lending Library


Indigenous Culture Kits

We have been given 6 different kits from the Qualicum First Nation Culture Kit Program for our lending library. This Program creates culture kits for use throughout British Columbia. These kits have been made in consultation with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, artists and educators. The culture kits are designed for children aged three years and older and are available to borrow by child care programs (3 to 5 years) and elementary school classes, from kindergarten to grade two. The kits include books, activities, felt stories, puppets, songs, poems and so much more. They are wonderful, artistic, colorful activity boxes with a wealth of information with which children can engage. Pictured below is the Cedar Kit. The other kits we have are the Raven Kit, A Walk in the Forest Kit, Animal Tracks and Scat Kit. B.C. Land Animals Kit. and the Traditional Foods Kits.

Felt Board and Felt Story Making Workshop - February 22, 2025

We began our Felt Story Workshop with a beautiful and meaningful land acknowledgement from Tracy, setting the tone of the importance of storytelling and relationship to culture and the land. Story telling being an ancient way of communication passed on from generation to generation. It comes in many forms and styles such as fables, fairytales, legends, myths, poetry, religious scripture, song and sharing real time events. They can be stories that relay a message or a moral, make you laugh or cry, or make you frightened or angry. Stories teach us about our culture and our relationship with each other, the animals and the land.

We chose to make felt boards and felt stories together with child care providers in this workshop because felt stories deepen the connection children experience with stories and songs. Adding the 3-D visual aspect of stories can spark imaginations, engage their attention on a different level and encourage children's participation in telling and re-



telling the story together. Felt stories can bring alive a child's learning and joy for stories. Making these felt boards and stories together was a wonderful way for us to be creative and connect joyfully too!

At the end of a great morning together, we had made some awesome resources to use with the children in our care!

Sunshine Coast Child Care Action Plan 2025

January 2025

Sunshine Coast Joint Child Care Council

In the fall and winter of 2024, the Child Care Action Plan Working Group, comprised of individuals from Vancouver Coastal Health, School District 46, and the CCRR program developed a new Child Care Action Plan for the Sunshine Coast. We developed this document so members of our community could refer to and work from a united vision and plan to create excellent, equitable, inclusive child care for all who need it.

From the Executive Summary of the plan:

Child care is foundational to the well-being of families, children, and communities. It enables parents and caregivers to fully participate in the workforce, supports gender equity, and strengthens the social and economic fabric of the Sunshine Coast. Quality child care plays a vital role in fostering early childhood development, providing children with a strong foundation to thrive.

Since the release of the 2019 Sunshine Coast Child Care Action Plan, significant progress has been made in expanding access to licensed child care spaces, addressing staffing challenges, and enhancing collaboration among community partners. Notably, the creation of new child care spaces for children aged 3 to 5 years has contributed to increased access rates, now at an estimated 64.9 spaces per 100 children (65%). Despite this progress, there remains a pressing need for additional spaces in Infant/Toddler and School Age care. While some growth has occurred in these areas, many families on the Sunshine Coast would benefit from further expansion to better meet their needs.

To address ongoing challenges, partnerships between local governments, community organizations, child care providers, and families remain critical. Collaboration has been central to recent successes, such as the expansion of child care spaces within School District No. 46 and the development of innovative programs like the \$10-a-Day initiative, which now benefits 16 programs across the Sunshine Coast.

Key barriers remain, including staffing shortages, insufficient access to inclusive care for children with support needs, and geographic disparities. Survey data from 2024 indicates that 16 of the 29 child care providers who responded are operating below their licensed capacity, primarily due to staffing constraints. In addition, families in smaller communities such as Madeira Park and Halfmoon Bay continue to face significant challenges accessing licensed care.

The 2025 Sunshine Coast Child Care Action Plan builds on past successes while addressing current needs. Grounded in local data and shaped by input from stakeholders, the plan outlines a roadmap to support the continued growth of a quality, inclusive, and affordable child care system. It highlights the importance of ongoing collaboration, advocacy, and targeted actions to ensure that families across the Sunshine Coast have equitable access to the care they need.
